YUA Special - Diverting Traffic at the Beach

"Yahoo! This is Miku in a pareo." - Miku

A pareo (or pareu) is a rectangular piece of printed cloth worn as a wraparound skirt.

"I'm at the Shonan Seashore." - Miku

The Shonan seashore is a popular hangout for young folks, especially surfers, bikers, and other hipsters. It is one of the most accessible beaches for the Tokyo Metro area and is located in the Kanagawa prefecture. You can also get a good view of Mount Fuji from there. In the summer, it gets unbelievably crowded.

Another thing that makes this area popular is the Tanabata festival, which is held from July 4th

through the 8th in the Hiratsuka City part of Shonan. The Tanabata festival is a traditional event based on a romantic legend of two lovers (2 stars) in the vast galaxy. In 2002, it attracted 3,100,000 visitors from all over Japan. All this in a city that is normally only populated by 255,173.

Because the festival occurs during the last days of the rainy season, not many people actually make it over to the beach, except for crazy surfers! Shonan's beach season starts up around mid to late July through mid-September.

Time for a quick lesson on the climate of Japan. Japan has a very diverse climate which includes the four seasons and is mostly temperate. In the northern part of Japan (eg. Hokkaido area), it's generally dry with very cold winters and mild summers. In the southern part (eg. Okinawa region), it is more humid and subtropical with mild winters and long, hot summers. In the middle portion of Japan (eg. Tokyo Metro area), there is a nice balance of cold winters with occasional snow, hot or warm summers, and mild springs and autumns. There are, of course, exceptions like in the Niigata Prefecture region, on the Sea of Japan side in the upper middle portion of Japan, where snowfall can sometimes reach 10 feet. Japan's rainy season usually occurs from June to early July although it does rain year round. Typhoons, which rarely last more than a day, usually occur in September or October.

"Today, Rte 134 is congested from around Chigasaki for 10 kilometers..." - Yukari Chigasaki is another city in the Shonan area with its own beach.

A Note about the Songs
